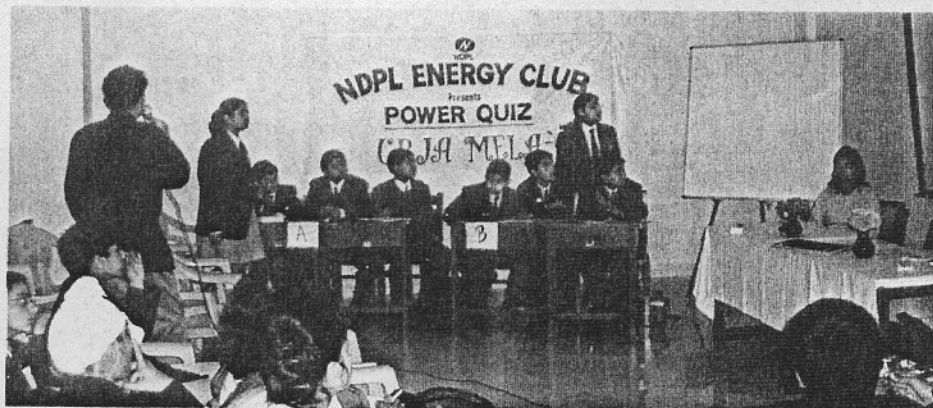


AN 'URJA MELA' FOR CHILDREN
